Misión Peniel began as an extension of Beth-El Farmworker Ministries in 2006, with the simple gesture of hospitality, providing sweet bread and coffee to the farmworkers in Immokalee, Florida before the sun rose. Beth-El hired Pastor Miguel Estrada, from Guatemala, and it soon developed into a pastoral ministry providing food, clothing, fellowship and emergency support to farmworkers and their families. When economic constraints made it necessary for Beth-El Farmworker Ministries to sever its support of Misión Peniel, Peace River Presbytery formally established Misión Peniel as a ministry of the presbytery in 2013. Today, Misión Peniel is a covenant partner with the Peace River Presbytery, as its own non profit and is sustained through volunteers, financial support from churches, individuals and organizations and most especially, through the love and prayers of many!

WHAT WE ACCOMPLISH

- We provide an environment for connecting and finding God's face in each other.
- Every Friday, between 400-500 community members are provided with fresh and nonperishable food items and other needed items.
- Every month, about 100 volunteers help sustain our outreach ministries.
- Every week pastoral care and counseling are provided to farmworkers.
- Every Saturday students participate in the music academy.
- The mission garden produces nutritious food for sharing with the farmworker community every week.
- "Pan de Vida" delivers meals and makes pastoral visits to home-bound and disabled farm workers.
- We partner with the Coalition of Immokalee Workers, Cultivate Abundance, Partners in Health, Health Care Network, churches and other organizations to respond to the priority needs of farmworkers and their families.
